1. The Nazi Ministry of Propaganda had control of all media: newspapers, books, video, radio, art, music, advertising, etc. Why was it so important to have total control of what people read or saw?
2. What kinds of technology do we have today to spread information that was not available in WWII?
3. When you see news, a story, or an image online, how do you know it is accurate or true? What steps can you take to discern fact from opinion?
4. Where have you seen propaganda in your own life? What do you do when you see hateful imagery online? What steps can you take to address it?
5. Think about current events pertaining to the experiences of BIPOC (black, Indigenous and people of color) in the United States. Choose an example in which racial minorities in the United States have been dehumanized and compare these depictions with any example of historical propaganda. Examples to choose from include:
 - a. Muslims in the United States after 9/11
 - b. Criminalization of Black People and Police Brutality
 - c. Stereotyping of Latinx Americans as Undocumented Immigrants and ICE
 - d. Anti-Asian Violence and COVID-19
